

The Mayor's Award for Community Service



WHAT?

Each year, the **Mayor** and the San Luis Obispo City Council honor San Luis Obispo High School students who have shown evidence of completing at least **80 hours of community service**. They honor the students with a certificate at the first **City Council** meeting in June.

In order to receive the **Mayor's Award**, volunteer hours must be documented through the **Community Service Verification Form**, available **online** or at the **College & Career Center** due on or before **May 15th**.

The Mayors Recognition is held the **first Tuesday in June** at the SLO City Council Chambers.

A student may earn this award more than once during high school.

COMMUNITY SERVICE IN CLUBS

Several clubs and some classes require students to fulfill volunteer hours. National Honor Society, Friday Night Live, Key Club, and Interact Club meet regularly on campus and facilitate students' involvement in the community. *Volunteering feels good and is a good way to get experience for a paid job.*
