All scholarship applications listed are online applications. Scholarships for SLOHS include:

◆ ***Maureen "Mo" Clancy Memorial Scholarship – due February 9, 2018***

The scholarship was established to honor the memory of Maureen "Mo" Clancy. Mo lived to help others and will forever be remembered as a strong-willed, loving and passionate person. Applicant is currently a senior girl at a San Luis Obispo County high school, planning to attend full-time at an approved community college, four-year college or vocational school. Scholarship value of \$2,000.

◆ ***Sera Day Coryell Nursing Education Scholarship – due February 9, 2018***

This scholarship supports graduating seniors attending high school in San Luis Obispo County. The Scholarship Committee intends to award one \$2,000 scholarship that may be annually renewed providing that the student is making satisfactory progress toward **Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program** requirements and maintains a 3.0 GPA.

◆ ***Douglas De Gross Automotive Studies – due March 9, 2018***

The Douglas DeGross Scholarship for Automotive Studies provides support to graduating high school seniors in San Luis Obispo County who are pursuing a career in the automotive industry. The applicant must be committed to pursuing a post-secondary education at an approved community college, four-year college/university or vocational school. The Scholarship Committee will award one \$2,000 scholarship.

◆ ***The Garris Family Scholarship – due February 9, 2018***

The scholarship supports graduating seniors at public high schools in San Luis Obispo County. Applicant must be dedicated to attend any post-secondary education, full or part-time. Applicant must be Pell grant eligible, with a minimum high school cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a maximum of 3.5, on a 4.0 scale. Awards will be at least \$1,500 and up to \$10,000.

◆ ***Gary Grossman Scholarship- for LGBTQ – due February 9, 2018***

The Gary Grossman Scholarship was established to provide post-secondary scholarship assistance to high school or college students who are gay, lesbian, bisexual or transgender. Awards will be at least \$1,000 and up to \$5,000.

◆ ***Kiwanis Club of San Luis Obispo Scholarship – due February 9, 2018***

The Scholarship will provide support to a deserving student who demonstrates academic achievement, leadership involvement, and need. Selection is not based on race, color, creed, religion, gender disability, or national origin. The Committee intends to award one \$2,500 scholarship.

◆ ***Martin Resorts Scholarship –for children of Martin Resorts employees – due February 9, 2018***

The Martin Resorts Scholarship awards two scholarships of \$1,500 to children of Martin Resorts employees that plan to continue their education after high school. The scholarship aims to recognize student leadership and achievements.

◆ ***Kelly A. McAdams Scholarship – due February 9, 2018***

Established to honor the memory of Kelly A. McAdams, a graduate of our local schools and a life long student with an inquisitive mind. The award is intended to support a deserving high school student from San Luis Obispo county. The Scholarship Committee intends to award a multi-year \$2,500 scholarship, with a total value of \$10,000 over the four years.

◆ **Justin McCutcheon Scholarship –for Varsity golfers in PAC 8 – due May 2018**

In memory of Justin McCutcheon, this scholarship will be awarded annually to a senior golfer attending a high school in San Luis Obispo or northern Santa Barbara County that participates in the PAC-8 sports league. Award value \$1,000.

◆ **Gary Paul Piantanida Scholarship – due February 9, 2018**

Established to fund scholarships for qualified students or graduates from a high school in San Luis Obispo County. The Scholarship Committee intends to award a multi-year \$3,000 scholarship, with a total value of \$12,000 over the four years. Merit, school/community service and financial need.

◆ **Burt W. and Virginia Polin Elks Scholarship – due February 9, 2018**

The Scholarship Committee would like to award one merit-based \$2,000 scholarship for a high school graduate pursuing a degree in public safety. The scholarship is based on the Elks tenets of: charity, justice, patriotism, good fellowship & service.

◆ **Dorothy Ross Memorial Scholarship – due March 9, 2018**

This scholarship was established to support students who have served time in juvenile hall and have demonstrated a life change and a commitment to higher education. The scholarship committee plans to award two (2) \$1,000.00 awards. *Renewable*

◆ **Alan D. Stephenson Scholarship for LGBTQ – due February 9, 2018**

The Alan D. Stephenson Scholarship was established to support promising LGBTQ students to achieve their academic potential. The scholarship is open to students graduating from high school in San Luis Obispo County. Students planning to attend a four year college or university. Award will be \$10,000 over a four year period.

◆ **Richard J. Weyhrich Leadership Award – due February 9, 2018**

Wanted: School and Community leaders! The Scholarship Committee would like to award at least one \$4,000 scholarship at each San Luis Obispo County comprehensive high school. This scholarship comes with recognition from the SLO County Board of Supervisors and a medal. If you are involved with your school or community, and demonstrate leadership potential this is for you!

◆ **John and Yvonne Hsu Edmisten in honor of Allan Voigt M.D. Scholarship – due February 9, 2018**

The Scholarship supports a student pursuing a major in science, technology, engineering, performing arts, or mathematics in pursuit of a baccalaureate degree in a four-year college or university. The Scholarship Committee intends to award one \$2,500 scholarship.
