SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES DUE IN SEPTEMBER

Stokes Educational Scholarship Program Deadline September 1st–October 31

Open to high school seniors, particularly minority students, planning to major in computer science or computer/electrical engineering. With the Stokes Program you will attend college full-time, then work during the summer at NSA's main headquarters in Fort Meade, Maryland, for a minimum of 12 weeks in areas that are related to you course of study. The Siemens Competition in Math, Science & Technology (STEM) Deadline: September 22

recognizes remarkable talent early on, fostering individual growth for high school students who are willing to challenge themselves through science research. Through this competition, students have an opportunity to achieve national recognition for science research projects that they complete in high school. Scholarship for winning projects range from \$1,000-100,000.

The American Legion Samsung Scholarship Deadline: TBD

Scholarship applications are restricted to high school juniors who attend the current session of either the American Legion boys state or Auxiliary Girls state program and are a direct descendant – i.e. child, grandchild, great grandchild, etc. – or a legally adopted child of a wartime veteran who served on active duty during at least one of the periods of war officially designated as eligibility dates for American Legion Membership. Samsung scholarships are for undergraduate study only and may be used for tuition, books, fees, and room and board. Winners are selected according to academic record, involvement in school and community activities, community service and financial need.
