Selection based on service, leadership, academic promise, work experience and future goals. GPA of 3.5 minimum required and at least three extracurricular experiences required. **Please include a current unofficial transcript.**

ALEX MAIER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

In honor of Alex Maier, #23 Soccer Player and student at SLOHS Class of 2013, who died from injuries sustained in a car accident. He was a Varsity soccer player and passionate about the game and his team. Alex was an organ donor whose incredible gift lives on. Applicants should exemplify the "spirit of Alex": fun loving, athlete and student.

ALLYSON BREE GOVE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Multiple awards of \$750 each. Selection is based on school involvement and character. High GPA not necessarily a prerequisite. One of the awardees must be a varsity athlete. Finalists will interview with representatives of the sponsoring organization. ***Write a statement of no more than 300 words about what you would do (if you had no limits) to improve your community.***

FILIPINO WOMEN'S CLUB OF SLO COUNTY

One \$200 scholarship for a student of Filipino ancestry with a minimum 3.5 GPA and excellent resume. Student must plan to attend a 2 or 4-year university. Financial need and Filipino background a must! Attendance at the ***Spring Luau with the organization is required. Current unofficial transcript required.***

FRANK C. HOLT OUTSTANDING SENIOR SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

This prestigious award is provided to one male and one female from the senior class. Applicants should have a wealth of leadership, scholastic, athletic and service experience. High GPA, and solid resume including Varsity athletic and leadership positions a high priority. ***Include one-page essay describing your leadership and how it has formed the person you are and hope to become. SWEASEY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP

The Sweasey Family is providing this scholarship. They have children who are alumni of SLOHS and are generous and supportive neighbors of SLOHS. Honoree will be a senior graduate with a minimum 3.0 GPA who has a proven track record of perseverance, excellent attendance, citizenship and evidence of financial need. **Please submit a note from the Attendance Office showing better than satisfactory attendance at SLOHS.**

WINIFRED SEARS "POP DAVIS" MEMORIAL
